WHO WE ARE

Nanze Children's Services is a 501(c)(3) organization that was founded in 2013 by Yakoob Badat. Nanze's mission is to create endless possibilities for the children of Malawi through grassroots initiatives in education, water, and poverty reduction. We encompass a vision of a world where today's African child is tomorrow's leader. We are an organization comprised of many initiatives and have constructed multiple school buildings, servicing children from the nursery to primary level. Our Nanze Primary school grounds include school buildings, a career-tech education building, a library, teacher and volunteer housing, staff work rooms, a health clinic, boreholes, and sanitation facilities.

Nanze is driven by volunteers on three different continents all with diverse backgrounds, a school committee, the District Education Officer, Welfare advocates, and village elders. Our core values include striving to serve the larger community, working for the equalization of females, aiming to promote honesty, integrity, and transparency through all of our activities, following the principles of international solidarity, service beyond self, and cooperation beyond borders, and having environmentally sound programs that are managed responsibly. Furthermore, our objectives have a centralized focus on education and community. Our educational objectives include adding classroom buildings, supplying furniture for the schools, providing instructional materials and resources, securing partnerships with the Ministry of Education to provide government trained teachers, and providing clean water and meals to students. Our community objectives include providing improved water quality, providing improved sanitation, and reducing poverty by providing sustainable economic support through livelihood programs.

NANZE'S EDUCATOR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Nanze Children's Services would like to invite educators to apply to our educator volunteer program. The program will take place during the Summer of 2025 and will include select educators that will travel to Malawi, Africa and teach at Nanze Primary School, which is located in Linthipe, Chickwasa Village, for the duration of 3 weeks. Selected educators will work under the guidance of Nanze staff while volunteering and will be accompanied by a coordinator of the program. Prior to their arrival at Nanze Primary School, the educators will spend 1-2 days in Lilongwe, the national capital of Malawi, getting acquainted with the culture and climate before their service begins. There will also be the opportunity to explore Malawi and experience the culture throughout the duration of the program.

There will be a \$1,000 program fee that educators are responsible for, which covers the cost of airfare, lodging, food, transportation, and laundry. There will also be an optional \$500 safari trip fee. The safari trip fee is subject to change due to currency fluctuation. Educators who are interested in the exchange program will be required to complete an application and interview process. **Applications are due by November 1, 2024.**

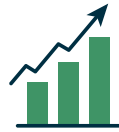
